Pursuant to our telephone conversation I am writing to obtain information about the service records of Commander H.R. Hubbard and his son Lieutenant Lafayette R. Hubbard, formerly of the U.S. Navy.

I would like to know where and when Commander Hubbard was commissioned, I believe in the Supply Corps, where he served both at home and abroad, including any war service, and for how long. Also the date of his resignation or retirement. The same applies to Lieutenant Hubbard.

As you know, I am doing a book on Mr. Hubbard and his organization for Harper & Row of New York.

From biographical material published in pamphlets produced by Mr. Hubbard's present organization I gather that he was commissioned in the Navy's Public Relations Department as a Lieutenant J.G. in 1941 and that he requested transfer to a PT Squadron. In December of 1941 Hubbard was said to be aboard a cargo loaded with PT boats en route to the Philippines, and that to avoid Japanese raiders the ship was diverted to Java.

It is reported that in the Spring of 1942 Hubbard was returned from the Far East as a casualty. There is a report that Hubbard was skipper of a patrol cruiser in Alaskan waters when a shell (friendly or enemy not specified) landed on the fantail. Hubbard is reported to have picked it up and dropped it overboard and received a severe concussion when the shell went off before hitting the water, the explosion loosening three ribs from Hubbard's spine and putting him in the sickbag. The patrol cruiser is listed as PC615.

Later in 1942, because of his experience as a yachtsman, Hubbard was reported in command of the former British corvette the "Mist" which served in antisubmarine warfare in the North Atlantic. Hubbard is said to have risen to command the squadron with the rank of full Lieutenant.

There is a hearsay report from a U.S. Marine officer to the effect that Hubbard got in trouble because of a shell fired on a German submarine which landed on Mexican territory.

Towards the end of the war Hubbard was reported released because of his physical condition to the Amphibious forces in the Pacific where he is said to have served aboard the AKA 54, or USS Algol, under Commander Axton F. Jones.

Hubbard says he spent the better part of 1945 at the Oak Knoll Naval Hospital in California because his optic nerve was impaired, causing blindness, and that he was lamed by injuries to his hip and back. He says his service record described him as "permanently disabled" but that he cured himself of his injuries and that by 1949 he was declared fit for active duty.

I would appreciate the above statements being checked against the official record for confirmation or denial.

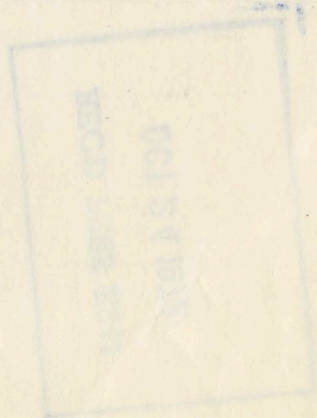

The personnel records of members and former members of the naval service are considered to be for official use only, and access to information in them is restricted to the persons whose record is concerned, to his duly authorized representative so designated in writing, to a government agency where the release of information is considered to be in the best interest of the government, or to a court of competent jurisdiction upon presentation of a properly authenticated court order to the Secretary of the Navy.

In view of the foregoing, the information you requested may not be furnished.

The files you released (which I have passed on to Mr. Hubbard) disclosed a request for information from the California Dept. of Justice and I believe subsequent disclosure of some files by your office to them. We are concerned with these disclosures and I wish to clear up a few things with you about them.

First, I would like to obtain copies of these specific documents starting with the August 1976 request from the California Dept. of Justice, Dept. of Law Enforcement. I would like copies of your replies, as well as an accounting of what information, if any, was turned over to them.

Additionally, I would like to know why any information was turned over to them, that is, what was the reasoning and authority relied upon by your office at the time. Also, if you or anyone in your office had contact with the California agency, maybe you could tell me why they made the request and what it was they were after.

Please let me know if any additional information is needed from me. I have not enclosed a copy of the Power of Attorney as after all our dealings, I did not deem it necessary at this time. I will however, be happy to once again supply you with a copy of it should you need it.

This is in response to your letter to Commander Walker of 1 June 1979 concerning release of information from the military personnel record of former Lieutenant L. Ron Hubbard, USNR.

As you requested, a copy of a request for record information by the California Department of Justice is attached along with the response provided. In this case, it appears that the inquiry was referred to the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, Missouri since the response was originated at that activity. Such referral is normal procedure since the inquiry involved a record that had been retired to that activity.

The information that was released is considered releasable as public information with the exception of information concerning military offenses and resulting disciplinary action, and records of psychiatric treatment. However, since there was no record of these subjects contained within Mr. Hubbard's record, no inpropriety is considered to have occurred in responding to the negative. The reason for the inquiry is unknown.
